





Travel and Tourism Work for Arizona



Arizona Travel Taxes Impact

Direct visitor spending generated \$2.8 billion in local, state and federal tax revenues, representing a \$1,150 tax break per Arizona household.

Local and state travel taxes generated \$1.5 billion, which is nearly enough to cover the wages of all police officers, secondary school teachers and firefighters in the entire state.



Gross Domestic Product (GDP) represents an industry's value to the economy. When compared to other top export-oriented industries in Arizona, the travel and tourism industry consistently ranks first or second in GDP output year over year. This consistent performance provides a vital stabilizing effect on Arizona's economy.


