### TRAVEL AND TOURISM WORKS FOR ARIZONA

2014 Data

- · Domestic and international travelers to Arizona spent \$17.6 billion in 2014 and generated \$2.4 billion to federal, state and local governments, dollars that help fund jobs and public programs such as police, firefighters, teachers, road projects and convention centers.
- The 163,500 jobs created by travelers to Arizona in 2014 represent 7.6% of the state's total private industry employment.
- · Without these jobs generated by domestic and international travel, Arizona's 2014 unemployment rate of 6.9% would have been 12.2% of the labor force.
- For every \$1 million spent in Arizona by domestic and international travelers, 9.3 jobs are created.

### Travel and Tourism is One of **America's Largest Industries**

- Generated more than \$2.1 trillion in economic output, with \$947.1 billion spent directly by domestic and international travelers that spurred an additional \$1.2 trillion in other industries.
- Directly generated \$147.9 billion in tax revenue for local, state and federal governments.
- Each U.S. household would pay \$1,192 more in taxes without the tax revenue generated by the travel and tourism industry.
- Direct spending by resident and international travelers in the U.S. averaged \$2.6 billion a day, \$108.1 million an hour, \$1.8 million a minute and \$30,033 a second.

## Travel and Tourism is America's **Largest Services Export Industry**

- \$133.0 billion\* in international travel spending in the U.S.
- Created \$22.5 billion in balance of travel spending surplus for the U.S.

### Travel and Tourism is One of **America's Largest Employers**

- Supported 15.1 million jobs, including 8.1 million directly in the travel industry and 7 million in other industries.
- \$231.6 billion in travel-generated payroll for those employed directly in U.S. travel
- One in every nine U.S. non-farm jobs is created directly or indirectly or is induced by travel and tourism.
- Travel is the 7th largest employer of all industries in the U.S.
