About the Arizonans Speak Poll

- Fielded June 25 July 9, 2019
- 975 Arizonans (registered and not registered to vote)
- Hispanic and rural residents were oversampled to achieve 200+ for each
- Web-based poll
- 12-minute average completion time
- Fielding and analysis from Hootology





Summary: Differences By Hispanic vs. Non-Hispanic

- 15 key metrics tested show unity between Hispanics and non-Hispanic residents across all topics
- The top areas of disagreement are immigration, climate issues, support for private school and the importance of several social issues



Hispanic - General Issues

Things that matter to Hispanic residents



- Hispanics consider most policy issues more important than the rest of the state
- Policy issues like childcare, mental health care, domestic violence and substance abuse are substantially more important for Hispanic residents








Hispanic - Education

- Top issues for Hispanics are increased school safety and teacher pay increases.








Hispanic - Immigration

Hispanic Immigration Perceptions



- Overall, Hispanics are much more pro-immigration than others.
- There are 15+ ppts. delta in feelings about deportation, ease of the immigration process and perceived fear of undocumented immigrants between Hispanics and other populations








Hispanic - Government



Rural Confidence in State Government



41% of Hispanics have some confidence in the state government, which is five percentage points lower than non-Hispanics








Hispanic - Economy

Hispanic Economic Perceptions



 Hispanic residents are <u>slightly</u> more likely to say they are better off or worse off than non-Hispanics. While they are 8 ppts. Less likely to feel the same as last year, the difference is split between better and worse.



Hispanic Perceptions



- Hispanics and non-Hispanics alike believe that AZ's agriculture is important to the nation and that AZ's partnership with Mexico is important.
- Big differences are seen in:
 - The need to do more about the climate (Hispanics more in favor)
 - Belief that agriculture doesn't have much impact on the environment (Hispanics are less likely to believe this)
